Welcome to the Dance J32 · 2RR · C facing C RR

Elinor M Vandegrift: Let's All Dance · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1c+2c circle4 L and back
- 9-16 1c+2c RHA; LHA
- 17-24 1M+2W & 1W+2M (= person opposite) turn RH, turn LH
- 25-32 1c to 2c A&R; pass dancer opposite Rsh to meet next couple

The Sailor R32 · 3/4L

RSCDS XXIV 4 · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1c cross down RH (2c up) to 2plx and BiL with cnrs; 1c cast R into lines across | all set
- 9-16 All Reels3 across, Rsh to 1cnr, finishing (2,1x,3)
- 17-24 1c lead down | lead to the top; cross and cast to (2,1,3)
- 25-32 2c+1c R&L.

Note: [3-4] is NOT in DTr position.

Delvine Side S32 · 3/4L

William (18C) Campbell: RSCDS II 9 · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1c+2c set | cross Rsh (no hands); repeat
- 9-16 1c down the middle and up, 2c step in
- 17-24 1c+2c Allemande, finish facing 1cnr
- 25-32 1c turn 1cnr BH, pass Rsh, turn 2cnr BH, cross Rsh to (2,1,3)

Note: older instructions tell 1c to turn once LH on 23–24; the current (revised) instructions leave that unspecified.

Leap Year Fair J32 · 2/4L

Lara Friedman-Shedlov \cdot Crib: SCDDB Contributed Cribs & Diagrams

- 1-8 1C cast off behind own lines and back
- 9-16 1C & 2C RH across and back
- 17-24 1C followed by 2C lead down; 2C followed by 1C lead back to the top to 2, 1
- 25-32 1C & 2C turn partners RH; turn partners LH

**General Stuart's Reel R32 · 3/4L

Castle Menzies (18C): RSCDS X 3 · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1M sets to 2W and casts off (2M up); 1W sets to 2M and casts off (2W up)
- 9-16 1c turn 1cnr RH | pass Rsh; turn 2cnr LH | pass Rsh to face 1cnr
- 17-24 SetH&G, finish BtoB, 1M facing up / 1W down
- 25-32 Reels3{6} with cnrs (Rsh to 2cnr) | 1c cross RH (2,1,3)

Miss Ogilvie's Fancy S32 · 3/4L

William (18C) Campbell: RSCDS XX 8 · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1c+2c Poussette (1,2,3)
- 9-16 1c lead down the middle and up | cast off (2c up)
- 17-24 1c+3c Circle4 and back
- 25-32 2c+1c R&L

Sister Blanche of St. Andrew's J32 · 3/4L

Bob McMurtry: The Devil's Quandary · Crib: MiniCribs

- 1-8 1s dance Fig 8 on own sides round 2s & 3s (1s in/down to start)
- 9-16 1s+2s+3s dance DoSiDo with partner & turn partner RH
- 17-24 1s lead down middle and back remaining in middle, 2s step in ready for...
- 25-32 1s+2s dance poussette

**The Maskin Rung R32 · 5/5L

Liz Donaldson: Between the Rivers

- 1-8 1C and 3C turn RH, cast, turn LH to 1st cnrs (2C and 4C step up bars 3-4)
- 9-16 1C and 3C turn 1st cnr RH, pass Rsh, turn 2nd cnr LH, pass Lsh to double triangles position up and down
- 17-24 All 5C dance double triangles; 1C and 3C finish on opp sides
- 25-32 1C and 3C cross RH, cast, turn LH once round (4C and 5C step up bars 27-28)

The Lea Rig S32 · 2/4L

RSCDS XXI 5 · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-16 1c+2c full Petronella (2c step up on [1–2] and join in, one place behind 1c. On [15–16] 2c petronella to 2pl).
- 17-24 1c lead down the middle and up
- 25-32 1c+2c RHA, end on diagonal; ½Poussette.

The Reel of the Royal Scots R32 · 3/4L

Roy Goldring: The Leaflet Dances with Music · Crib: E-cribs

- 1-8 1W+2W (1M+2M) turn LH (RH) %, finishing 1c BtoB in 2pl | All set as in DTr; 1W+3W (1M+3M) turn RH (LH) % | 2c+3c+1c set as in DTr
- 9-16 1c followed by 3c dance up between 2c, cast off; dance NHJ down through 3pl, cast up to face 1cnrs, 3c looping into 3pl
- 17-24 1c turn 1cnrs RH, pass Rsh (cnrs dance for {4}); turn 2cnrs RH (same), and cross Rsh to (2,1,3)
- 25-32 All circle6 and back

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The Maskin Rung

a 32 bar reel for 5 couples

Bars 1 – 4	1^{st} and 3^{rd} couples turn partner with right hands and cast off one place, as 2^{sd} and 4^{th} couples step up.
5 – 8	t^{st} and 3^{rd} couples turn partner with left hands to face 1^{st} corners.
9 – 16	(see note below) 1 st and 3 ^{sd} couples turn 1 st corners with right hands, pass partners in the center by the right shoulder to turn 2 nd corners with left hands, pass partners in the center by the left shoulder to finish back to back in the center, women facing up, men down, ready for
17 – 24	(see note below) 5-couple double triangles up and down the dance: 1st woman joins hands with 2st couple (who face down). 1st man and 3st woman join hands with 4st couple (who face in, making a diamond shape). 3st man joins hands with 5st couple (who face up). On bars 23-24, 1st and 3st couples dance a petronella turn into second and fourth places on the opposite sides of the dance (2 pas de basque).
25 – 28	1st and 3st couples cross giving right hands and cast off one place, 4th and 5th couples step up on bars 27-28.
29 - 32	1st and 3rd couples turn with left hands once round to own sides.
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Repeat from new positions.

Notes:

Bars 9-16: Supporting couples dance the turns for 4 bars. 4th man and 4th woman dance turns by right hands as 1st corner and then by left hands as 2nd corner, dancing the full 8 bars.

Bars 17-24: Supporting couples dance pas de basque for the full 8 bars.

Devised by Liz Donaldson, 1973.

The Maskin Rung is the pole used to stir whisky malt. A song with this title appears in <u>The Scottish Folksinger</u> by Norman Buchan and Peter Hall. It tells of a maiden who fools an unwanted suitor by dressing up a maskin rung and leaning it against a tree; he thinks it is she and tries to woo her. This song resembles the Child ballad "The Broomfield Wager."
