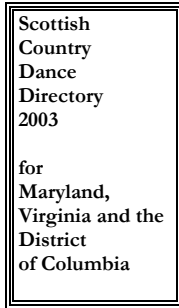
RSCDS Book 42 Dance-Through

Pat Ruggiero reports that Susan de Guardiola, a dance historian from Connecticut, will lead a workshop in 16th Century Italian Renaissance dance in Charlottesville on March 15, a Saturday, and *may* conduct a Regency workshop in the DC area the following day, March 16. RSCDS AGM and Elections Report from Jim Healy

(November 5, 2002 Strathspey server message)

It will be remembered more for what did not happen. To put that in context, this was the year when the elections to implement the very significant changes in the management structure decided last year were held.

The Saturday started with the very last Executive Council meeting. All were aware of the history being made but accepted that an era had passed. The meeting was as short as it was possible to be. The various Convenors' reports ... were taken at a spanking speed and minutes were ratified more or less unanimously with minimum comment.

We were out in time to attend the second discussion group on the future format of AGM weekends. It was proposed for the consideration of the Management Board that, in addition to the AGM proper, it should comprise a Branch Forum at which Branches could formally raise issues of concern, ideas for the future etc. i.e. items that would not normally come under the business of an AGM agenda. Bruce Frazer on behalf of B/H/S Borders Branch undertook to co-ordinate this and his offer was accepted. It was also felt that the existing Open Forum at which individual members could raise any subject under the sun also had a place and should continue.



No binding votes would be taken at either meeting but they would provide an opportunity to "send messages" to the Management Board.

There was an earlier discussion group on Youth matters which I believe was very interesting but I did not attend as it clashed with the Executive Council. ...The AGM was also brief and all resolutions were passed although many agreed with Keith Bark of Toronto that the wording of the transitional voting provisions might have been clearer. However, as Alan Mair pointed out, the AGM does not take amendments from the floor...

Saturday night we set up for the Argyle Ball. We prepared the hall with festive decorations created by Mary Andrews. The variety of delicious treats being donated by everyone was amazing. The Ball began with the procession of St. Andrew's Cross (I had the privilege of escorting Kate Nealley, one of our teaching VIP's) and continued with one fantastic dance after another. By the time my head hit my pillow that night, I was both thoroughly exhausted and exhilarated. My only regret about Argyle weekend: so many lovely ladies, only 27 dances.

Beth Murray, Burlington, MA (staff musician): Arriving to a dance weekend where most of the people are strangers can be a bit intimidating; but I must admit that the high energy level was immediately contagious. Due to plantar faciitis, I was concerned that I would be left alone on the sidelines. However, there was a constant stream of conversation, and several people willing to put up with my hobbling dance capabilities – who could resist that stunning music. Martha Phillips, Madison, WI: [When asked to be brief]: “It’s hard ... Here goes. It was great! I had a good time. Everybody go next year, OK? See what I mean? Very dull.”

[Original response, in part:] I was very wet (it was raining), muddy (did I mention the rain?), tired and exceedingly late... And yet, regardless of my frazzled state of affairs, I was engulfed immediately by friends from all corners of eastern America, long past and newly met. As the bright Maryland sunshine greeted us the next day (as well as the nice warm breakfast), Ramblewood drew us cleanly away from the worries we live with in our regular lives. ...It was the evenings in the great hall where we all sensed the power of the dances we shared. ...To dance at Ramblewood is to dance with all, to laugh with all, and to share the joy that drew us to Scottish Country Dancing in the first place.

Debbie Bilmers, Montreal and Boston: As a first-timer at Ramblewood I was hugely impressed by...the friendliness of the other dancers, the excellence of the teachers and musicians, and the organization of events. I had a ball (no pun intended) dancing all day and night as well as jamming with the other musicians during those rare moments of spare time. I definitely plan on returning to the warm, welcoming, and often sweaty atmosphere.

Jim Casalegno, Bristol, RI: We had a wonderful time. Everyone was friendly and helpful. Advance instructions were adequate in helping us prepare for the camping aspect of the weekend. Food was terrific. Instructors and musicians were fantastic. What more could you want?

Jeanne and Mike Millin, Winnetka, IL: As Mike and I drove down the Ramblewood drive, my nervous anticipation went away as we were greeted by a few familiar faces, new people that came up to us in greeting, with our packets and even a glass of wine. The setting was relaxing, the music was excellent and even though many of the participants knew each other for a long time, I always felt included in meals and conversation. Top teachers and great instruction contributed to a weekend we hope to repeat.

Beth Kingsley, Washington DC: The location is key. Out in the woods, away from distractions of daily life, nothing to do but dance. And sing, and listen to music (what wonderful music!), talk to friends, swim, and relax. (Sleep may happen, but seems to be optional.) It’s wonderful to see so many dancers, and the energy on the dance floor when it’s this full (almost, but not quite, too crowded) makes sore feet and tired legs part of tomorrow’s worries. How is it that anyone has energy to be that witty and amusing at the ceilidh after a full day and night of dancing? Did I mention the (wonderful, incredible, absolutely fantastic) music?

Rebecca Ramsey, Mt. Airy, MD: My impression was so totally fantastic I hope I will never miss the weekend again. The setting was so fun, took me back to camp when I was in grade school. My favorite memory will be walking down from the house to the ball. The moon and stars were putting on quite a show....It was easy to believe that we had been transported back in time.
